Dear Coaches,

The Colorado Volleyball Official's Association has been preparing for the upcoming season. As I begin my term as the President of CVOA, I have many tasks before me. One of my points of focus is to bring an understanding to our membership of the importance of consistency. Not just the consistency of one official from set to set, but from one official to another throughout the season. I know that we will never have 100% consistency, because we are not robots that can be programmed to make the same call time after time. However, we can focus on teaching techniques and skills that bring us all a little closer in the consistency spectrum.

I have also visited with many coaches in the past year concerning the evaluations that CHSAA has made available online. I believe that this is a tool that will help CVOA in addressing training needs and concerns. This tool is not being used to the extent that CVOA and CHSAA had hoped. Coaches have voiced apprehension about sending in the evaluations because they don't want the officials to see their feedback. If a poor evaluation is given, there is a perception that the officials will see them and know what was said concerning their performance. This is not the case! Tom Robinson is the only person that sees those evaluations. If a problem arises that needs to be addressed, he will bring that issue to me or another Executive Committee member. The official will never have access to the report. Tom has strong feelings on the confidentiality of these reports. We don't get to view them. We only receive a summary from Tom about an issue that needs to be taken care of. Please take the time to evaluate the officials you see throughout the year, good and bad. Your report is confidential and the feedback is used to strengthen our training programs and address problems that arise. The link can be found on the CHSAA website.

I look forward to the upcoming season. Please don't hesitate to contact me with questions, concerns or suggestions you may have.

Thank you for all of your amazing support of Breast Cancer Awareness Month this past year! This fall, during the volleyball season and in conjunction with the American Cancer Society, the CHSAA will once again be promoting breast cancer awareness throughout the month of October. This coincides with National Breast Cancer Awareness month. The purpose of the campaign is to raise breast cancer awareness in young women and their mothers.

We are encouraging schools to “think pink” and come up with a way to promote Breast Cancer Awareness at a home volleyball match during October. The CHSAA will provide each school with special PSA’s for the evening and a card for each player to hand to her mother and/or a significant woman in her life that will highlight important health reminders.

All over the country volleyball teams are holding events to support breast cancer awareness, and we would encourage you to promote this as much as you can! Some suggestions are:

- Play a “Pretty in Pink” match. Both teams could play in pink uniforms and/or encourage fans to wear pink. Teams could play an exhibition point or warm up with pink volleyballs and raffle them (please remember that you cannot play a match with a pink ball). Donations from the match could be sent to a cancer society.
- Have a “Dig 4 a Cure,” “Kill the Killer,” or “Blocks for a Cure” match and ask for donations for every dig/kill/block that happens during the match. Money can be donated to a local cancer society or someone in your community that’s been touched by cancer.

## **“CHECK YOUR SCHEDULES”**

Before the competitive interscholastic season begins, check to make sure you have not scheduled contests in excess of the set/contest limit for your sport (see CHSAA Sport Bylaws).

**\*\*IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COACHES BE CLEAR ON THE NUMBER OF MATCHES THEIR TEAM WILL PLAY IN A GIVEN TOURNAMENT. THIS INFORMATION MUST BE INCLUDED IN THE TOURNAMENT CONTRACT.**

No member school shall permit any of its volleyball teams to participate in more than 19 volleyball matches exclusive of district, regional and state tournaments.

A player may not participate in more than 95 sets in a season exclusive of district, regional and state tournaments.

Teams that have played more contests than allowed in the Sport Bylaws will be restricted from playoff activities, without appeal.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The CHSAA Constitution and Bylaws are the official rules of the Association. Information in this bulletin provides the regulations for volleyball competition, but never supersedes the regulations found in the Constitution and Bylaws.

Included in the school boxes is an official copy of the CHSAA Handbook Constitution and Bylaws. Handbooks are also available on line at [www.chsaa.org](http://www.chsaa.org) by selecting Bylaws. Checking eligibility is not the sole responsibility of the athletic director. It is the responsibility of the coach to know the information found in the Constitution and Bylaws. Therefore, the Bylaws should be read prior to the season.

We encourage the telephone calls on areas of eligibility be made by the school athletic director or designated administrator; rulings on season policies can be made by the volleyball coach. Please contact Bethany Schott, Assistant Commissioner for volleyball.

## **EXERPT FROM THE 2009-2010 CHSSA BOARD OF CONTROL...**

### **MAJOR CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR'S (2008-2009) BOC REPORT:**

1. Regional host sites were alternated for 1A and 2A.
2. 3A-4A Qualifier criteria changed.
3. 4A-5A District seeding alignment changes.
4. 5A seeding criteria clarified and updated.
5. 3A-5A state seeding criteria modified slightly.

### **RATIONALE FOR MAJOR CHANGES:**

1. Per the rotation schedule.
2. Allows playoff opportunities for new schools.
3. More balanced competition at district tournaments; some changes per the rotation schedule.
4. Clears up questions from the 5A District Seeding Committee.
5. More closely aligns the criteria with 1A-2A.

### **\*\*\*NEW - WINTER VACATION PRACTICE/COMPETITION**

There shall be no school sponsored activity of any sort, including practices, camps, clinics, tournaments, etc. from and including December 24 through December 27 and New Year's Day. **Beginning December 28, winter sports programs may have voluntary practice (excluding Sundays), but may not compete in interscholastic scrimmages or competition.**

## 2009-10 NFHS Major Rule Changes

(Please refer to page 2)

- 2-1-1** Clarifies the court and the adjacent playable area must be flat, smooth and free of obstructions other than required equipment and padding.
- Rationale:** Clarifies court/floor requirements for playable area.
- 3-2-1** Beginning in 2010-11, the set ball may be either solid white or a maximum combination of three colors (with each panel being a solid color) and of which at least one-third of the panels shall be solid white.
- Rationale:** Allows for the optional use of the colored-panel ball beginning with the 2010-11 season. The colored-panel ball makes it easier to track for players/spectators and adds excitement to the set.
- 4-1-5** Unadorned bobby pins, no longer than 2 inches, may be worn to control a player's hair.
- Rationale:** Allows players a practical means of dealing with hair control.
- 5-3-4d** Prior to the deciding set, captains will be called for the coin toss by the R1 and then teams shall be released to their team bench.
- Rationale:** Releasing teams to their bench rather than the end line during the deciding-set coin toss will allow coaches to provide instruction and facilitate players being ready to take the court for the final set.
- 5-4-3b** The second referee has the responsibility to manage illegal libero replacements.
- Rationale:** Adds to the responsibilities of the second referee.
- 9-4-5** A legal contact is a touch of the ball by any part of the player's body.
- Rationale:** In today's fast-paced set, allowing legal contact of the ball by any part of the player's body will assist in keeping the ball in play and provide longer and more exciting rallies.
- 10-2-3** If more than one substitution is to occur, the substitutions shall be made in succession. One pair of players after another and only one substitute shall be in the substitution zone at a time.
- Rationale:** The procedure of recording multiple substitutions becomes easier for the scorer to record. This will speed up the substitution process and assist in maintaining the tempo of play.

**12-2-5** Clarifies when an assistant coach may stand and actions the coach may perform.

**Rationale:** Clarifies the role and bench decorum of the assistant coach now that the head coach has the privilege to stand during the match.

**12-2-6, 9-1-1** During play, allows the head coach to stand in the replacement zone, no closer to the sideline than 6 feet, to coach his/her players.

**Rationale:** Due to the growing spectator popularity, resulting in louder crowd noise, this change will allow the head coach to communicate more effectively with his/her players. The permitted location for standing preserves the necessary area for clear line of sight by the second referee and line judges to observe play and playable area around the court for the players.

## GENERAL CHSAA GUIDELINES

Coaches are responsible for their staff and players. Each coach should review the season guidelines and the CHSAA Bylaws with his/her staff.

### PHYSICAL EXAMINATION/PARENT PERMIT

Check the school records to see that each athlete has a statement signed by the parent or legal guardian and a doctor (MD, DO), Nurse Practitioner, Physician's Assistant, or Dr. of Chiropractics who is School Physical Certified (DC, Spc.) certifying that each participant has passed an adequate physical examination on file with the athletic director.

### BLOOD

A student with blood borne pathogens such as HIV or Hepatitis B shall be eligible to participate in all CHSAA sanctioned activities when CHSAA recommended precautions are in effect. Bleeding must be stopped and open wounds must be covered before a student competes.

### NINE DAY PRACTICE RULE

Each student competing in a fall interscholastic sports program must have had a minimum practice period of nine days in her sport (exclusive of Sundays) before representing her school in an interscholastic contest or scrimmage. Be sure to check your transfer students for proper days of practice before allowing them in a set or scrimmage.

### PLAYER BENCH OCCUPANTS

Teams will always be seated on the same side of the net as they play.

During the contests, the player bench may be occupied only by the following: eligible substitutes, coach, assistant coaches, faculty representatives, team managers, team statisticians and scorekeeper, team trainer or doctor, and disqualified players, unless they have been instructed to remove themselves from the player bench.

### WARM-UP

There will be a maximum 15 minute warm-up period between matches unless the scheduled start time dictates otherwise. The 15 minutes will begin as soon as the court is cleared from the preceding match. It is the responsibility of the home site's administrator to oversee warm-up time.

The following format is **highly recommended**:

- 5 minutes – Both teams on their side of the court.
- 5 minutes – Visiting team both sides of the court (including serving).
- 5 minutes – Home team both sides of the court.

### PENALTY FOR LEAVING THE PLAYING FLOOR BEFORE SET IS COMPLETED

Withdrawing a team from the playing floor before the completion of a contest can have great consequences. The CHSAA Constitution and Bylaws state: "No member school may withdraw its team from an athletic contest prior to the termination of the contest, except by mutual consent of the responsible faculty representatives from the participating schools."

## DISQUALIFICATION FOR UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

Any player who has been ejected from a match or tournament for committing any unsportsmanlike act shall be disqualified for the remainder of that match or contest. In addition, the player shall be ineligible for the next regularly scheduled match or contest of the same level (sophomore, junior varsity, or varsity). She may not take part in any other sets or contests at any level during this time. The number of matches, meets or contests for which the participant has been declared ineligible will decrease the stated maximum allowable matches, meets or contests in each sport for the disqualified participant. A school may not schedule a contest after an ejection in order to circumvent the penalty.

If such ejection occurs in the final match or contest of the season, then that player shall be ineligible for the first match or contest of the next season of sport that player elects to play. In satisfying the penalty, the player must sit out a set in a sport in which she completes the season.

Any player ejected from a second match or contest during the same season shall be ineligible for the next two matches or contests of the same level. Any player ejected from a third match or contest during the same season shall be subject to a penalty to be determined by the Commissioner.

## EJECTION OF A COACH

CHSAA Bylaws require that a coach under contract with the school district must assume supervisory responsibility for all interscholastic contests. If a coach is ejected and no credentialed person from that school is available, the contest shall be forfeited.

A coach ejected from a contest for committing an unsportsmanlike act shall be ineligible to coach for the next regularly scheduled match or contest of the same level. He/she may not coach in any other contest at any level during this time.

A coach ejected from a set is automatically placed on probation according to policies established by the Executive Committee.

A coach ejected from a second contest during the same season shall be ineligible to coach for the next two contests of the same level.

A coach ejected from two contests during a five-year period shall be required to appear at a hearing before the Commissioner or his/her designee and shall be subject to a penalty to be determined by the Commissioner.

A coach ejected from three contests in a five-year period shall be placed on restriction.

## TAUNTING

Taunting is considered any action(s) or comments by coaches, players or spectators which are intended to bait, anger, embarrass, ridicule or demean others, whether or not the deeds or words are vulgar or racist.

Set officials shall, in all sports, follow the rules set forth by the National Federation for each sport. Penalties under these rules may include ejection or other penalties for flagrant unsportsmanlike offenses.

Taunting in all sports and/or activities is an unsportsmanlike offense which may result in a set ejection with penalties as outlined in the student ejection policy (CHSAA Handbook, Article 22, Rule 2200.1 and 2200.11).

### OUTSIDE COMPETITION

Players certified to participate as members of any high school sport team may compete on any other team, in any non-school activity or event in that sport during that sports season with the express written permission of the principal, which permission shall be granted if: (a) the student's class attendance is not compromised; and (b) the student is in good academic standing under the school's activities policy applicable to all students.

**EXCEPTION:** The sports season ends for a member of a high school athletic team on the day following the completion of his or her school's competition at the level at which the student competes. (CHSAA Handbook, Article 21, Rule 2100.11.)

### RESTRICTION FOR PLAYING JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS

Scrimmaging, practicing, or competing against junior high schools, non-school teams, or individuals constitutes a violation.

### SUNDAY PRACTICE RULE

No high school interscholastic contests, practices for interscholastic contests, camps, nor association between participants and coaches/directors of any activity from the student's school shall take place on Sunday at any time during the school year.

### VOLLEYBALL UNIFORMS

Please be sure to check the uniform regulations found in the NFHS Volleyball Rules Book (pages 13-16). It is highly recommended that you give the manufacturer a copy of the guidelines when you order new uniforms. Please do not hesitate to call the CHSAA office if you have any questions.

**Although like uniforms are preferred at all levels, varsity is the only level that will be penalized for uniform violations.**

### RALLY SCORING FOR SUB-VARSITY MATCHES

It is strongly recommended that 2 out of 3 sets be played at all sub-varsity levels to enhance time management constraints. Further recommendations to shorten nights include:

1. Go to fewer points such as 15 or 21 (can have a cap such as 15 points or 21) Therefore, teams could win 15-14 or 21-20; you don't have to win by 2 points if there is a cap.
2. Monitor warm-up time between matches.
3. Flip coins before the first sub-varsity match for all matches that will be played that evening/day.
4. Use of multiple nets and/or gymnasiums where available.

\* Play is recommended for Saturdays to decrease the amount of school missed and alleviate travel time.

*\* If a team from a league that has adopted a certain format plays a team from a league that has adopted a different format the two coaches must agree before the match begins. Otherwise it will be 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points (no cap) with the deciding set to 15 points (no cap).*

## **RANDOM ACTS OF SPORTSMANSHIP INITIATIVE**

In a recent meeting of the Sportsmanship Committee the decision was made to identify what the committee feels happens more often than most people think and that is our teams, student-athletes, coaches, student bodies, parents, and fans participate in positive acts of sportsmanship. Therefore the Committee stole from the concept of random acts of kindness to propose a project for the CHSAA called Random Acts of Sportsmanship.

At this past summer's meetings of the National Federation of High School Associations (NFHS), the inaugural presentation of the Spirit of Sport of Award was given to Evergreen High School for encouraging and selecting an autistic student to participate as a cheer athlete. It was unprecedented in that this cheer athlete was a full member at all cheer activities, including competitions. The Evergreen cheer squad did care about their scores in competition but only that they compete as a team. This was a random act of sportsmanship. Team was placed above winning.

Within our 338 schools, the committee knows that this type of positive sporting behavior happens all the time in the CHSAA. The Committee is asking that you announce this project to your student body to be on the look out for random acts of sportsmanship. The Committee/CHSAA will select from the pool of submissions and pick the top five, which will be presented at the fall Sportsmanship Symposium. Those individuals who participated in these random acts of sportsmanship will be recognized at the Symposium as well.

## CHSAA SPORTSMANSHIP EXPECTATIONS

The following items are standard rules of conduct for district, regional and state tournaments and are strongly recommended for regular season contests:

Please Note: **The administration from each school is responsible for the conduct of its own crowd.** Cooperation with CHSAA personnel and site directors is necessary in maintaining proper crowd control. Administration should report to CHSAA personnel upon arrival at site. When the CHSAA refers to sportsmanship, it means active demonstration of competitive integrity and ethics; respect for opponents and officials; fair play; understanding of the rules; appreciation for all performances regardless of school; personal and institutional pride; and, gracious acceptance of results. Join with the CHSAA in promoting good sportsmanship by showing the Sportsmanship Video to all participants, students, coaches and fans; develop a special sportsmanship program for your school; display the CHSAA Sportsmanship Banner in your school to show your commitment to the educational values that athletics provide your students.

### When to Salute the Flag

When the National Anthem is played or Pledge of Allegiance is recited, students, players and fans should stand at attention, face the flag and place their right hands over their hearts.

### Cheerleaders/Pom Pons/Crowd Conduct

- Positive Cheers Only. No profanity from the crowd will be tolerated.
- Megaphones may be used by cheerleaders ONLY.
- All patrons must wear shirts and shoes. Painted torsos are prohibited.

### Banners

- Professionally-produced cloth or plastic school banners only. Paper banners are prohibited, as are all hand-painted banners.
- Positive statements only on banners.
- Banners must not block the view of others.

### Noisemakers

Noisemakers that may interfere with the officiating or playing of the contest are strictly prohibited.

- Drums, whistles, cow bells, thunder sticks and bleacher kicking are prohibited.
- Megaphones may be used only by cheerleaders on the floor.

### Bands

- Bands may play only during a dead ball.
- No instruments of any kind may play during a live ball.
- No amplified instruments of any kind may be used.

### Announcer

The announcer should be a faculty member or responsible adult who can set the tone of the set by calling the fans attention to the following points of reference:

1. CHSAA playoff contests are conducted under the strictest code of good sportsmanship
2. The officials are neutral individuals and have been selected because of demonstrated ability;
3. Fans are encouraged to support their own team and display proper protocol and sportsmanship.

**Any damages to a facility incurred by crowd, players, students or coaches will be the financial responsibility of the school.**

## **MEDIA SUGGESTIONS**

1. One of the best methods of selling your program to the public is to make friends with the media.
2. Free publicity is yours if you take the time to contact the media and establish open lines of communication.
3. Send the local media your season's schedule with the starting times, locations of matches, and names of opponents.
4. If you expect coverage, you must be willing to be contacted at home. Make yourself available to the media.
5. Have photos of your team done early in the season.
6. Treat your media representatives hospitably. Have press seating available to them at home sites, and have programs and statistics ready for them.
7. Of the utmost importance is the assignment of a conscientious person to call in results immediately following the match.

## SCORERS INFORMATION

### Selection of Scorer-Timer – Assistant Scorer (Libero Tracker)

It is essential to have competent scorers and timers. Please appoint two to three competent and experienced adults. It is essential that these officials thoroughly understand their responsibilities. It is recommended that your official scorer wears identifying apparel and that the scorers' locations are clearly marked.

If necessary, it is acceptable for your timer to also track the libero (assistant scorekeeper).

### Priorities at the Official Table (Scorers' Bench)

Efficiency-plus is expected at the officials' table. Careful supervision will assure the officials at the table the most desirable, adequate, and pleasant working conditions possible

## DEFINITIONS FOR STATISTICIANS

(See Rules Book, page 48)

- Serve:** Contact with the ball to initiate play.
- Point:** A point is awarded when the receiving team violates a rule during play.
- Penalty Point:** A point which is awarded when the receiving team violates a rule during play or a dead ball.
- Replay:** A replay is the act of putting the ball in play (other than at the start of the set) without awarding a point or a side-out and without a service rotation.
- Re-serve:** When the server releases the ball for service, then catches it or drops it to the floor.
- Ace:** A serve which lands in the opponent's court without being touched, or is touched but unable to be kept in play by one receiving team player.
- Block:** A player or players block the ball into the opponent's court leading directly to a point or loss of rally.
- Assist:** A player passes or sets to a teammate who attacks the ball for a kill.
- Attack:** Any action other than a block or serve that directs the ball toward the opponent's court.
- Dig:** An underhand or overhead defensive saving skill **resulting from a kill attempt** in which the ball is contacted by the forearm(s), fist(s) or hand(s) **and allows the ball to remain in play for the next hit.**
- Kill:** An attack by a player that is un-returnable by the receiving player on the opposing team and leads directly to a point or side-out/loss of rally.
- Loss of Rally Point:** Awarded when the serving team violates a rule during play.
- Note:** A replay does not constitute an attempted serve since the serve did not develop into a point or side-out/loss of rally.

# DISTRICT VOLLEYBALL

## ALL CLASS INFORMATION:

1. **SITES:** District Sites will be selected by the appointed school administrators. Designated school administrators for 1A and 2A will poll the assigned schools within a district and report the site to the CHSAA according to the established rotations. The sites for 3A and 5A will be determined by league finish.
2. **QUALIFIERS:** Districts are played for placement of teams into regionals. All classes (1A-5A) will qualify two teams to Regionals.
3. There will be no consolation or third place matches at district tournaments unless the match determines a regional qualifier.
4. **OFFICIALS:** Officials will be selected by the district directors/tournament committee or assignor. Line judges must be adults. If available, registered officials shall be used. Line judge fees would be part of the host school expenses. Line judges will use flags at the State Tournament. District Site Directors may choose to use flags.
5. **TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE** (see page 42) must be utilized. The hot line number (720.581.8102) must be used whenever there is a tie to verify tie-breaker accuracy for final standings.
6. Schools advancing to Regionals need to make sure **their District Tournament Directors have a copy of their entire record (including Districts) before leaving the tournament site (see "Results Form")**. The District Director will fax season records to the CHSAA office.
7. **GATELIST to Kukulski Brothers:** If your team has a chance to qualify for the state tournament, **you must electronically submit the 2009 State Volleyball Tournament Gatelist and Program Information to the CHSAA office and to Kukulski Brothers by Thursday, October 1, 2009.** A team photo must be sent directly to Kukulski Brothers—do not send the photo to CHSAA.

# DISTRICT VOLLEYBALL GUIDELINES: ALL CLASSES

## WARM-UP

There will be a maximum 15 minute warm-up period between matches unless the scheduled start time dictates otherwise. The 15 minutes will begin as soon as the court is cleared from the preceding match and the coin toss is conducted. It is the responsibility of the home site's management to oversee warm-up time.

The following format is **highly recommended**:

- 5 minutes – Both teams on their side of the court.
- 5 minutes – Visiting team both sides of the court (including serving).
- 5 minutes – Home team both sides of the court.

## TEAM PRACTICE

Schools are not permitted to practice at their district site the week of the tournaments. Teams that normally practice and/or play at these sites are exempt from this policy.

## CONTESTANTS' ROSTERS

Each school may suit up 14 players for the tournament. Once the 14 players' names are placed in the score book for the first match at the District Volleyball Tournament, no other names may be entered the remainder of the tournament. Names on a team may change between district, regional, and state.

## FORMAT

*\*It is recommended that all districts be played on Saturday (whenever possible) using two courts. If a district elects to use the pool play format, the following formula is based upon the number of teams in a district.*

- Four teams** - total (six matches of a round robin format).
- Five teams** - recommend a pigtail to get to four teams. Pigtail is one match plus six matches; total (seven matches).
- \*Six teams** - two pools of three teams (1, 4, 6 in one pool; 2, 3, 5 in the other pool) - (six matches plus three matches for cross-bracketing between the pools); total (nine matches).
- Seven teams** - recommend a pigtail to get to six teams. Two pools of three teams (six matches plus three matches for cross-bracketing between the pools, plus one pigtail); total (ten matches).
- Eight teams** - two pools of four teams (1, 4, 5, 8 in one pool; 2, 3, 6, 7 in the other pool) - (six matches per pool = twelve matches) plus three matches for cross-bracketing between pools; total (fifteen matches).
- Nine teams** - #8 will pigtail with #9 to arrive at 8 teams - 2 pools of four teams (1, 4, 5, 8 in one pool; 2, 3, 6, 7 in the other pool) - (six matches per pool = twelve matches) plus three matches for cross-bracketing between pools, plus one pigtail; total (sixteen matches).
- Ten teams** - pigtail #7 with #10 and #8 with #9 to reach 8 teams. Winners play for #7 seed - 2 pools of four teams (1, 4, 5, 8 in one pool; 2, 3, 6, 7 in the other pool) - (six matches per pool = twelve matches) plus three matches for cross-bracketing between pools, plus three pigtails; total (eighteen matches).

### TIES

Ties are not considered; the tie-breaker method (for tournament competition) must be used for all Post-Season Tournaments. The hot line number (720-581-8102 or 303-344-5050) must be used whenever there is a tie to verify tie-breaker accuracy for final standings (see page 42).

### AWARDS

**Champion and second place plaques will be awarded to teams advancing from each district.**

### TEAMS QUALIFYING FOR REGIONALS

All teams qualifying to regional tournaments must deliver complete season records through districts (including non-league matches), to the District Tournament Director. District Tournament Directors must fax or email the complete season records (including Districts) for the 2 teams advancing to Regionals to the CHSAA office by 6:00 am, Sunday, November 1, 2009. The Regional Pairings Meeting will be held at 10:30 am.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS**

- Post and update tournament bracket & time schedule.
- Communicate to participating schools; all schools in your district should know specifics about your facilities, starting time, pairings, exact locations of all sites, etc.
- Ticket/financial reporting (The CHSAA office will email this report to you prior to your district tournament)
- Make all arrangements by mutual agreement with the District Volleyball Tournament Committee.
- Select officials with mutual agreement of the District Volleyball Tournament Committee. Line judges will use flags at the State Tournament. District directors may choose to use flags.
- **Fax (303-367-4101) or e-mail ([bschott@chsaa.org](mailto:bschott@chsaa.org)) the names of the teams advancing to regionals with their overall records to the CHSAA immediately following districts to use at the regional seeding meeting on Sunday November 1, 2009. Teams failing to do so may be seeded at the committee's discretion.**

It is recommended that Site Directors build in a 15 minute rest period for teams having played back-to-back matches prior to a subsequent match.

NOTE: Prior to the District Tournament, the Tournament Director will contact all teams involved and mutually agree to not play any district match that has no bearing on the outcome of the tournament. CHSAA will also be notified of the agreement prior to the District Tournament.

Exception: In the case of inclement weather, the Tournament Director, in conjunction with the CHSAA office may obtain permission to not play matches that appear to have no bearing on the result.

## 1A & 2A DISTRICTS

### PROTECTION OPTIONS FOR DISTRICTS:

**OPTION A** – If an entire league is assigned to one district, the league may elect to dispense with district tournament play. League standings would then determine the qualifiers.

**OPTION B** – If an entire league is assigned to one district, the league may elect to play a district tournament and guarantee their league champion a regional berth.

a. The league championship must be won outright to guarantee a regional berth.

**OPTION C** – In multi-league districts, there is no qualifier protection; tournaments must be played to determine qualifiers to regionals. Leagues may not supersede this rule.

a. Multi-league districts will include one representative from each team assigned to the District Tournament Committee, plus a tournament director

### 1A-2A DISTRICT SEEDING CRITERIA

District tournament committee may determine pairings according to win/loss records among teams involved, common opponents for the season, or record for the season. (District Tournament Committee should decide seeding in situations where a lower seed wins over a high seed in pigtail matches, i.e., does the lower seed assume the higher seed position or are the seeds re-numbered?)

### FORMAT (see page 20)

Single elimination may be used in the preliminary rounds. Round robin or pool play is recommended in the following rounds. It is recommended that in pool play, 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points with deciding set to 15 points using rally scoring (no cap) be used. When using a 4-team pool play format, the tournament committee may choose to play 2 out of 3 sets to 25 points rally scoring (no cap). If there is an odd number of teams in a district, **pigtails** may have to be played to arrive at an even number to lessen the number of matches required if pool play is selected. Pigtail matches will be played prior to the district tournament or played the day of districts.

## 3A, 4A & 5A Districts

### PROTECTION OPTIONS FOR DISTRICTS

Since all districts are multi-league districts, there is no protection. Tournaments must be played to determine #1 and #2 qualifiers to regionals.

### DISTRICT SEEDING CRITERIA

- 3A-4A Seeding is predetermined through the waterfall method.
- 5A will be true seeded (see page 29). League Representative must fax/email league results by 6:00 am Sunday, October 25<sup>th</sup> in order to be seeded appropriately.

### FORMAT (see page 20)

It is recommended that in pool play, 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points with deciding set to 15 points using rally scoring (no cap) be used. When using a 4-team pool play format (3A), the tournament committee may choose to play 2 out of 3 sets to 25 points rally scoring (no cap). When using a 6-team pool play format (4A-5A), please use the recommended format and timetable as listed on page 21

Every district will qualify two teams to regionals. Single elimination may be used in preliminary rounds. Round robin or pool play is recommended in following rounds. 2. All of the above teams will now be true seeded with the league champions hosting a district playoff.
3. The seeding committee should first place the league champions into a category called "Tier 1" (1-8 seeds). If a team in a "mixed classification league" (4A & 5A, etc.) does not win its league outright, move them down into "Tier 2" (remaining teams). If a team in an all 5A league becomes league champions via a league tiebreaking procedure, they are kept in Tier 1. Once the league champions have been determined, keep them in Tier 1.
4. Then, true seed all of the remaining teams in Tier 2 in order to fill any remaining spots in Tier 1.
5. If there are openings in Tier 1, move up the top seeded teams from Tier 2 to fill any vacancies. All Tier 1 teams will now be true seeded (1-8) based on the seeding criteria below, and will host districts.
6. Finally, seed all of the remaining 9-48 seeded teams (Tier 2) based on the below criteria. The number 9th seed will be placed in District 8 with the 8th seed, the number 10th seed will be placed in District 7 with the 7th seed, etc.
7. Each league will be responsible to provide a representative to serve on the seeding committee. The representative must not be a member of a volleyball coaching staff.

### Criteria for the seeding process

1. When determining seeds, the committee shall consider, but not be limited by, the following factors (in no particular order of importance):
  - a. Overall record
  - b. Strength of league
  - c. Strength of competition
  - d. Head-to-head competition and common opponents.
2. A team may not be seeded above a team that finished above them in league play.
3. Seeds 1-24 will be true seeds based on the above criteria. Seeds 25-48 may move up one place or down one place in order to try and avoid teams from the same league being in the same district.

Please Note: If the committee cannot agree on a seeding of a team, the chairman shall call for a vote of the committee. The chair will vote only to break a tie. The seeding committee will be determined by CHSAA.

# 2009 REGIONAL VOLLEYBALL

## ALL CLASS INFORMATION:

1. Regional sites and officials will be selected by the appointed school administrators. Designated school administrators in 1A & 2A will poll the assigned schools within a region in the spring of the year and report the site to the CHSAA according to the established rotation (where applicable). 3A-5A sites are determined by Regional Pairings Committee.
2. **QUALIFIERS:** Regionals are played for placement of teams to State. All classes (1A-5A) will qualify 2 teams to State.
3. **OFFICIALS:** Officials will be selected by the regional directors/tournament committee or assignor. Line judges must be adults. If available, registered officials shall be used. Line judge fees would be part of the host school expenses. Line judges will use flags at the State Tournament. Regional Site Directors may choose to use flags.
3. **TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE** must be utilized (see page 42). The hot line number (720.581.8102) must be used whenever there is a tie to verify tie-breaker accuracy for final standings.
4. *\*It is recommended that all Regionals be played on Saturday (whenever possible).* Match times are approximate; pool play 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points with deciding set to 15 points using rally scoring (no cap) will be used for regional play.
5. Schools advancing to the State Tournament need to make sure **their Regional Tournament Directors have a copy of their entire record (including Regionals) before leaving the tournament site.** The Regional Director will fax season records to the CHSAA office.
6. **GATELIST to Kukulski Brothers:** If your team has a chance to qualify for the state tournament, **you must electronically submit the 2009 State Volleyball Tournament Gatelists and Program Information to the CHSAA office and to Kukulski Brothers by Thursday, October 1, 2009.** A team photo must be sent directly to Kukulski Brothers—do not send the photo to CHSAA.

## REGIONAL GUIDELINES: ALL CLASSES

### WARM-UP

There will be a maximum 15 minute warm-up period between matches unless the scheduled start time dictates otherwise. The 15 minutes will begin as soon as the court is cleared from the preceding match and the coin toss is conducted. It is the responsibility of the home site's management to oversee warm-up time.

The following format is **highly recommended**:

- 5 minutes – Both teams on their side of the court.
- 5 minutes – Visiting team both sides of the court (including serving).
- 5 minutes – Home team both sides of the court.

### TEAM PRACTICE

Schools are not permitted to practice at their regional site the week of the tournaments. Teams that normally practice and/or play at these sites are exempt from this policy.

### CONTESTANTS' ROSTERS

Each school may suit up 14 players for the tournament. Once the 14 players' names are placed in the score book for the first match at the Regional Volleyball Tournament, no other names may be entered the remainder of the tournament. Names on a team may change between district, regional, and state.

### OFFICIAL BALL

Wilson Sporting Goods, through the CHSAA, will provide the Wilson I COR High Performance #H7700XWHI tournament balls for the regional tournament. **Balls will be shipped to host sites the Wednesday before the tournament begins.** Substitute balls may not be used.

### SCHEDULE

*\*It is recommended that all districts be played on Saturday (whenever possible).* Match times are approximate. National Federation rules dictate 3 out of 5 sets to 25 points (no cap) with the deciding set to 15 points (no cap).

- A #2 district finisher will not be seeded higher than a #1 district finisher from the same league even though the #2 may have finished higher in the league.
- C. When determining seeds, the committee shall consider but not be limited by the following factors (in no particular order of importance): strength of league/district, overall record, strength of competition, head-to-head competition and common opponents.
- D. If the committee cannot agree on a seeding/pairing, the chairman shall call for a vote of the committee. The chair will vote only to break a tie.

The seeds will not be a true seed based on the requirement to separate teams from the same districts.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES OF REGIONAL TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR**

1. Post and update tournament brackets & time schedule.
2. Communications to participating schools; all schools in your regional should know specifics about your facilities, starting time, pairings, exact locations of all sites, etc.
3. Ticket/financial reporting. (The CHSAA office will email this report to you prior to the regional tournament.)
4. Make all other arrangements by mutual agreement with the Regional Volleyball Tournament Committee.
5. Select officials with mutual agreement of the Regional Volleyball Tournament Committee. Line judges will use flags at the State Tournament. Regional directors may choose to use flags.
- 6. Regional directors will fax (303-367-4101) or e-mail ([bschott@chsaa.org](mailto:bschott@chsaa.org)) the names of the teams advancing to the state tournament with their overall records (including districts & regionals) to the CHSAA immediately following regionals to use at the state seeding meeting on November 8, 2009. Teams failing to do so may be seeded at the committee's discretion.**
7. It is recommended that Site Directors build in a 15 minute rest period for teams having played back-to-back matches prior to a subsequent match.

**NOTE:** Tournament directors must play all matches in the regional tournament and may not eliminate matches that appear to have no bearing.

**Exception:** In the case of inclement weather, the Tournament Director, in conjunction with the CHSAA office may obtain permission to not play matches that appear to have no bearing on the result.

# STATE VOLLEYBALL

## ALL CLASS INFORMATION:

1. Eight teams will be assigned to two pools of four teams on five courts. Competition will begin for all classes on Friday, November 19, 2009..
2. Court classification will be rotated each year.
3. A first place trophy and second place plaque will be awarded.
4. **OFFICIALS:** Officials are assigned using input from schools and CVOA. They have been carefully selected from all available officials registered with CHSAA. Daily match assignments are made by CHSAA staff members without consultation with school officials.
5. **OFFICIAL BALL:** Wilson Sporting Goods, through the CHSAA, will provide the Wilson I COR High Performance #H7700XWHI tournament balls for the state tournament.
6. **CONTESTANTS' ROSTERS:** Each school may suit up 14 players for the tournament. Once the 14 players' names are placed in the score book for the first match at the State Volleyball Tournament, no other names may be entered the remainder of the tournament. Names on a team may change between district, regional, and state.
7. **GATELIST NFORMATION:** Passes will not be provided. Each coach must submit a gatelist and each player will be checked by name upon entry. The gatelist/entry form can be found online at [www.chsaa.org](http://www.chsaa.org)

If your team has a chance to qualify for the state tournament, **you must send program information to the CHSAA and to Kukulski Brothers NO LATER THAN THURSDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2009, to be included in the state program.**

A team photo must be sent directly to Kukulski Brothers—do not send the photo to CHSAA. The team photo must be received by Thursday, October 1, 2009. Do not wait to see if your team will qualify—send the photo by October 1, 2009. The program information can be found online ([www.chsaa.org](http://www.chsaa.org))

## **TEAM PRACTICE**

Schools are not permitted to practice at the state site the week of the tournaments.

## **DRESSING ROOMS**

Limited dressing space will be available. Please be considerate of the team which will use the facilities following you. Try to keep the dressing facilities as clean as possible.

## **BENCHES**

There will be 14 chairs for each team. No more than 20 people will be allowed in the area, including players. Please take the responsibility of clearing your own bench.

## **TIME OF THE MATCH**

Matches will never begin before scheduled times on Saturday. If a match ends early, teams may warm-up on the court.

## **CONDUCT**

The Volleyball Tournament is one of the finest opportunities to display your school's SPORTSMANSHIP and spirit. We earnestly request your complete cooperation in this matter.

## **HOME TEAM**

The highest seeds determined by the Sunday pairings tournament committee will be the home teams.

## **COIN FLIP**

The visiting team will call the coin flip. NOTE: Coin flips will be conducted after the second set of the preceding match. Coaches and captains must be present for the coin flips.

## **WARM UP PROTOCOL**

Friday and Saturday matches will begin at 8:00 a.m. for all classes and will use the following 8 minute format:

- Serving team first 4 minutes of court time including serving.
- Receiving team next 4 minutes including serving.
- There will be no shared hitting.

Warm ups will begin at 7:42 a.m. Teams will come off the court at 7:50 a.m. to allow time for pre-match ceremonies.

## **AWARDS PRESENTATION**

Please ask your fans to remain off the court; there will be a formal presentation. The awards will be brought to mid-court and presented following each championship set. A bracket will also be given to each championship team.

## **PARTICIPATION CERTIFICATES**

Each participant at the State Volleyball Tournament will receive a certificate for qualifying to the state level in their playoff series.

## STATE SEEDING/PAIRING CRITERIA

Pools: **Pool I: Teams 1, 4, 5 and 8**

**Pool II: Teams 2, 3, 6 and 7**

### **1A-2A**

1. The Tournament Pairings Committee shall consider but not be limited by the following factors: (in no particular order of importance): Strength of league/district, overall record, strength of competition, head-to-head competition, common opponents.
2. A regional winner may be seeded lower than a second place finisher from that same region.
3. The committee will make every effort to insure that no two teams from the same district or regional are placed in the same pool.

### **3A-5A**

1. The Tournament Pairings Committee shall consider regional place of finish and rank regional winners one through four. When determining seeds, the committee shall consider, but not be limited by the following factors (in no particular order of importance): strength of league/district, overall record, strength of competition, head-to-head competition and common opponents. No #2 finisher from a regional shall be seeded above a #1 finisher.
2. The #2's are paired using the criteria listed above.
3. Teams from the same league may be paired in the same pool.

## FRIDAY - STATE VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT

Eight teams are placed into two pools of four to determine seeds #1 and #2 from each pool to cross bracket and then play for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place. National Federation rules dictate three out of five sets to 25 points (no cap) with the deciding set to 15 points (no cap). Coin flips will be conducted after the second set of the preceding match. Coaches and captains must be present for the coin flips.

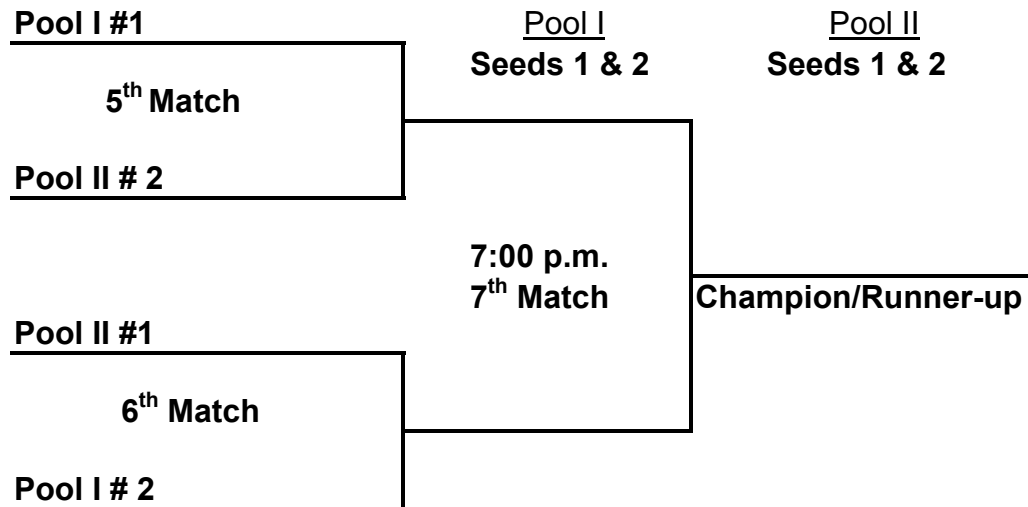

## TIE BREAKER METHOD (for tournament competition)

**\*\*In Case of Tie See "For Use By Site Directors Only" Below\*\***

1. Match record determines the seed for advancement (i.e. match record 3-0, 2-1, 1-2).
2. Always use head-to-head whenever two teams are tied.
3. When three teams are tied for the #1 seed, apply the following tie-breaker in order (a, b, c, d) and determine the highest of the three teams. **THERE MUST BE ONE ONE-SET PLAYOFF. SEE BELOW**
  - a. **Eliminate non-tied teams.** Determine the set percentage among **TIED** teams. (sets won ÷ total sets played among tied teams)
    1. Take the highest set percentage team as the #1 seed. If two teams have the same percentage, use head-to-head to break the tie.
    2. The two remaining tied teams will then play 1 set to 25 points to determine the #2 seed. (no cap)
  - b. If three teams are still tied for the #1 seed, **eliminate non-tied teams**, use point differential among **TIED** teams (total points earned minus total points against).
    1. Take the highest point differential as the #1 seed. If two teams have the same point differential, use head-to-head to break the tie.
    2. The two remaining tied teams will then play 1 set to 25 points to determine the #2 seed. (no cap)
  - c. If three teams are still tied for the #1 seed, **re-instate non-tied teams**, use set percentage among **ALL** teams. (Sets won ÷ total sets played)
    1. Take the highest set percentage team as the #1 seed. If two teams have the same percentage, use head-to-head to break the tie.
    2. The two remaining tied teams will then play 1 set to 25 points to determine the #2 seed. (no cap)
  - d. If three teams are still tied for the #1 seed, **re-instate non-tied teams**, use point differential among **ALL** teams (total points earned minus total points against).
    1. Take the highest point differential team as the #1 seed. If two teams have the same point differential, use head-to-head to break the tie.
    2. The two remaining tied teams will then play 1 set to 25 points to determine the #2 seed. (no cap)
4. For a 3-way tie for the #2 seed or if there is a three way tie for only one qualifying spot, **eliminate non-tied teams**, determine set percentage among **TIED** teams. The two lowest set percentage teams will play 1 set to 25 points (no cap). The winner will then immediately play the highest set percentage team to determine the #2 seed. If two teams are tied with the highest set percentage, use head-to-head to break the tie. **THERE MUST BE TWO ONE-SET PLAYOFFS.**
  - a. If tie isn't broken, **eliminate non-tied teams**, then same procedure will be followed taking point differential among **TIED** teams.
  - b. If tie isn't broken, then same procedure will be followed taking the set percentage among **ALL** teams.
  - c. If tie isn't broken, then same procedure will be followed taking point differential among **ALL** teams.

## **CHEERLEADER ADMITTANCE** **GUIDELINES**

All cheerleaders must enter at the designated competitors' entrance gate. Cheerleaders will be admitted at no charge to playoff events, providing each member of said groups complies with the following conditions:

- Cheerleaders must be in uniform, accompanied by coach. NOTE: Two coaches for cheerleaders and one director for bands will be admitted at no charge.
- All performing groups, (i.e., dance groups) must make previous arrangements with the tournament director. The tournament director will arrange for admission either by passes, gate list, or other means. NOTE: This is for district and regional events only.
- The amount of cheerleaders admitted is designated by classification.
- Cheerleading coaches are asked to observe the following:
  - To play only at time-outs and intermissions during these games
  - To give consideration to the “other fellow.” Every school should have the chance to complete a cheer and to have its band play. (A meeting of cheerleaders and bandleaders prior to the game always helps to insure good sportsmanship.)

### **Pep Band Admission Information**

A pep band with membership up to 35 members, including the band director, will be admitted to all CHSAA playoff events free of charge under the following conditions:

- All band members must be in possession of an instrument
- All members will be admitted as a group together
- No electric amplification is allowed
- To play only at time-outs and intermissions during these games
- The group performs under the performance rules of the individual sport and the group is an active participant in the contest (plays at appropriate times, etc.); Only 5 percussionists are allowed.
- No additional pep band members will be allowed to perform even if they purchase a ticket.
- Do not allow band instruments, drums, etc., to be used as noisemakers. Drums should be considered as musical instruments only. Schools may bring pep bands to district/regional/state tournaments, but the director must approve the band prior to the tournament date.

## EXPENSES

### QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT GUARANTEES

- A. If two teams are in a playoff and the host school will not guarantee expenses of the team designated to travel and that team will guarantee the expenses of the designated host school, then the site shall be reversed, and the host team will be required to travel. (Note: In either case, the school originally assigned the host role will retain that status for the purpose of charged home contests and coin flips.)
- B. If neither team will guarantee the deficit, the match will be played at the designated site and both teams will share in the deficit. The school originally determined to host will prepare and submit the required CHSAA financial statement.
- C. In district and regional tournaments involving three or more schools, the host school shall receive 20% of the gross for expenses to conduct the tournaments. IF THE 20% OF THE GROSS IS NOT SUFFICIENT AND THE HOST SCHOOL INCURS A LOSS, ALL PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS, INCLUDING THE HOST SCHOOL, ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYING AN EQUAL SHARE OF THE LOSS.
- D. In all situations in which the home school is responsible for guaranteeing the expenses of the visiting school, it is strongly recommended they provide a check for the guaranteed expenses to the visiting team administrator on the day of the contest. If, because of additional receipts, more money is due the visiting team, a check shall be sent for the additional amount within seven business days of the contest.
- E. In order to defray expenses, the host school shall consider all ways to eliminate costs. The use of volunteers (parent, booster or student organizations) is encouraged. Only absolute and necessary workers should be hired. Hospitality should be limited and the numbers of officials should be hired as directed by the Board of Control.
- F. Guarantees are subject to the type of bracket and playoff format designed by sport committees. In many cases travel costs, crowd size and host guarantee can be decreased by prudent sport playoff design.

**NOTE:** Every school hosting a post-season pigtail, district or regional match must submit a financial report to CHSAA.

**The financial form will be emailed to you prior to the state tournament.**

### DISTRICT/REGIONAL PLAQUE INFORMATION

District Tournament: District Champion - \$33.80; District 2<sup>nd</sup> Place - \$28.10

Regional Tournament: State Qualifier - \$35.55

### MEAL EXPENSES

- A. Meal allowance, where permitted in team competition, will apply at all district, regional and state playoff tournament levels when travel is in excess of 60 miles (road miles one-way) and/or involves overnight lodging for tournament play.
- B. Each team may choose any restaurant for meals. The team will pay for their meals, and be reimbursed later in accordance with the following schedules:
  - The Commissioner will decide the number of allowable meals for district, regional and state.
  - Teams will be allowed meals on the following basis: Breakfast - \$4.00, Lunch \$5.00, and Dinner - \$6.00 (maximum 17 people).

- Any school entering a team of fewer players than 14 will be allowed meals for the actual number of players entered.
- Meal allowances are based on the maximum number allowed (17) for actual meals eaten.

The above meal allowance does not apply to the host school.

### HOTEL EXPENSES

- A. Hotel allowance will be \$12.00 per night (maximum 17).
- B. A team must travel at least 200 miles one-way before overnight lodging is allowed. It must travel 325 miles one-way before the second night lodging is permitted. Hotel lodging should be approved in advance by the Commissioner. (Note: Does not apply to two day state tournaments.)
- C. In the event a two-day tournament or more is involved, schools must receive prior approval from the CHSAA office for the allowable number of overnight lodging and corresponding meals. This will be predicated on the scheduled starting time of the school's first contest, weather conditions and overall distance from the site.
- D. In the event of an emergency such as a storm and the traveling team is forced to remain longer, a contingency fund will be set up by the CHSAA to defray unexpected expenses. Such hardship cases will be decided by the Commissioner. If the balance of the contingency fund is unable to cover costs, it will be prorated among the affected schools.
- E. Hotel expenses will be allowed for actual overnight used.

### TRANSPORTATION ALLOWANCE

The following is established for all district, regional and state playoffs. It is based on round trip mileage for each actual participant. The designated number includes coaches and non-participants.

#### **Volleyball**

**Maximum 17 - 5.0 cents per mile based on actual participants.**

Note: For the state volleyball tournament, schools in a metropolitan area will be allowed the actual cost of the bus for transportation, not to exceed \$90.00 per day.

### STATE ONLY

A team's expenses will cease after that school's representatives have been eliminated from further participation. This is not intended to affect return home expenses. Allowances will be made for travel, meals and hotel if gate receipts exceed the expenses and the balance is sufficient.



## INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

The following policy statements represent the general operating procedures of the CHSAA regarding post-season competition that is threatened by inclement weather. Circumstances not covered by this policy are left to the discretion of the CHSAA office.

**NOTE:** Schools and individuals have the added responsibility of making alternative travel plans to contest/tournament sites based upon weather forecasts, etc. As a common factor, input and recommendations are to be sought from the Highway Patrol Division of Highways and Travel.

### Team Competition

1. **Dual:** The scheduled starting time and/or date of a contest/event may be adjusted upon consultation and mutual agreement of the administrators from the two affected schools as well as consultation with the CHSAA office.
2. **Tournament Conferences:** In the event inclement weather prevents a team(s) from arriving on time for a scheduled contest as part of a post-season tournament, the following steps will be enacted.
  - a. Notify the tournament director or designee with complete details a minimum of four hours before the scheduled starting time the day the tournament is to begin and/or other affected days of the tournament.
  - b. If unable to arrive for the scheduled starting time, that segment of the bracket (match) will be moved to a later time slot that evening following the completion of scheduled contests.
  - c. In the event "b" is not possible, the match(es) will be rescheduled the following morning where the schedule permits at a time to be set by the tournament director.
  - d. In the event "c" is not possible and the contest(s) cannot be rescheduled due to a facility and/or schedule conflicts, etc. the contest shall be declared a forfeit. When a consolation bracket is available, the team unable to make the contest will enter the consolation bracket.
  - e. When the number of schools participating is 25% or more that are unable to be present, the tournament/conference director, in consultation with the CHSAA, shall postpone all or part of the day's contests/activities. Alternative brackets and time schedules shall be determined by the director, in consultation with the CHSAA, which may include the contest/tournament.
